10:00 am - 4-5 mile easier hike


2:00 pm - M-DTS Members Meeting

Driving Directions: From Wrightsville area: Take US Rte 30 heading east across the Susquehanna and follow it 28 miles. Turn slight right at Gap onto Rte 41 and follow it 9.1 miles. Turn right on Rte 10 for 3.9 miles. Then turn left onto Rte 896 (Newark Rd) and follow it for 11.7 miles.

From South & West: Cross Conowingo Dam on Rte 1. Veer right on Rte 273 and follow it to Newark, DE. Turn left onto Rt 896.

Life membership is available for \$250.



Central Section - Havre de Grace to Lock 12: Coordinator: Pat Yale

 New M-DTS member, Bo Hopkins, will maintain the M-DT from Havre de Grace to Conowingo. The blazes on the M-DT through Susquehanna State Park need refreshing. We need an improved route for the M-DT up the slope from Stafford Rd in Susquehanna State Park (Map 6: Mile 14.3 West to East). The park ranger and MCC group are willing to work with us on this project.

PP&L have relocated and improved the trail at Lock 13. The M-DT follows the PP&L trail in this area:

Western Section - Lock 12 to Western Terminus at Whisky Springs: Coordinator: Ron Gray



• The Thursday retiree group have completed two relocations along Otter Creek: 1) the climb from the Rt 425 bridge over the creek (Map 4: East to West, Mile 0.3 +) and 2) a relocation through a recently logged area starting at Mile 1.8.

• Jim Hooper and Ron Gray have been negotiating with property owners for an off-road relocation between Wizard Ranch and the Marietta Water Company property (Map 3). One property owner is holding out. If it goes through, the relocation will provide an off-road route between Accomac Rd and the River Rd-Furnace Rd intersection. Negotiations are ongoing for permission to relocate the M-DT off-road between Murphy Rd and the Water Street Rescue Mission property (Map 3). These potential relocations would take 7 miles of the M-DT off road.

The M-DT blazes through Gifford Pinchot State Park have been refreshed.

Other Business

Muddy Creek Parking: Apparently, the situation at present is that vehicles parked on the north side of Muddy Creek at Gaging Station bridge are being towed away. That area is in Lower Chanceford Township. Vehicles parked on the south side of the bridge, which is in Peach Bottom Township, are not being towed.

KTA Meeting Report: Jim Hooper is the M-DTS representative on the Keystone Trails Association Council. He attended the spring KTA council meeting at Wellsboro. He reports that KTA membership is now over 1000 due to the KTA membership letter and application form included with the newsletters of member clubs. Volunteer trail maintenance hours spent on Pennsylvania hiking trails in 2005 totaled over 3400 (882 hours on the M-DT).

was held for KTA Board members in December to aid in the process of writing a strategic planning retreat grant was received to pay for the process which was conducted by the University of Pittsburg School of Public and International Affairs which services non-profit organizations.

Workshop: Jim and Joyce Hooper and Ron Gray attended a workshop about approaching property owners for permission to route a trail across their land.

M-DTS Sign-up Sheet: Jim Hooper recommended that our M-DTS sign-up sheet included a disclaimer. Jim will provide the secretary with the appropriate wording.

Nominating Committee: A nominating committee was appointed to provide a slate of candidates for election as officers of the M-DTS. Committee members are Anthony Belfiglio, Yvonne Blades and Joyce Hooper. The term of the present officers ends December 31, 2006. The current treasurer (Mary Bleecker) and secretary (Yvonne Blades) are retiring after 15 years on the job. The current president (Anthony Belfiglio) is moving to North Carolina.
