COMMENTS

Those of you who saw the budget for Pisacl 1980 (Estimated in October, 1979) will note in the Annual Treasurer's Report of June 30, 1980, that our receipts were down by about \$1,000 and our expenses were down by about \$1,500. This general trend is repeated in the Semi-annual Treasurer's Report of December. 31, 1980.

As to receipts, major contributions which were reasonably anticipated in October, 1979, did not materialize. To date KTA has contributed nothing and the contribution of a corporate supporter was less than expected. On the

other hand, we have received unexpectedly generous contributions from individuals and several clubs. These have enabled us to do part of our work. We have been seriously restricted in publishing newsletters and maps, making trail signs or printing bumper stickers. Patches and Dues Notice/Membership Cards have been obtained, although the latter have not been paid for yet.

As to expenses, I would like to bring to your attention that no travel expenses have been paid, and that only a trivial amount has been paid for office expenses. Most of the latter, that paid to Dave Toland, was returned to M-DTS as contributions. In addition, Dave contributed the expenses he received from the Wilmington Trail Club, plus a generous personal check so that he is now our second Life Member. Other expenses for travel, photocopying, mailing and telephone have been absorbed by the officers who incurred these expenses.

The constitution provides that dues and contributions, but not application fees, paid by individuals, shall be credited towards life membership of \$250.00. The Membership List shows the amount credited to date opposite each individual's name, under the heading "Equity & Contribution." This heading is used also to list receipts from clubs and corporations.

M-DTS was recognized as an exempt, non-profit corporation on April 28, 1980. Therefore, all payments to M-DTS since 1979 are deductible from federal income tax. Our IRS Identification Number is 23-2116461. For those renewing membership in 1981, remember that the \$3.00 Application Fee need be paid once only in the first year of membership. Our dues year begins January 1, so 1981 dues are payable after December 31, 1980. Amounts for various classes of members are shown on the Dues Notice card.

I wish to say a belated thanks to all of you who have supported us during the past year, and express the hope that you will continue to do so in the coming year.

NEWSLETTER FALL 1980

ORGANIZATION

A need for an independent service organization to construct the MASON-DIXON TRAIL was realized after a meeting in July of 1979 with Philadelphia Electric Company and other major landowners along the trail route.

The M-DTS was organized on September 19, 1979, at a meeting in Rohrerstown, Pennsylvania.

We received our Certificate of Incorporation from the State of Pennsylvania on October 18, 1979.

We were granted Federal Income Tax exemption as a publicly supported non-profit organization under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code on April 28, 1980.

TRAIL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM

BRANDIWINE SECTION: C.C.T.C.* (Horseshoe Trail to Chadds Ford). Complete except for signs. Much rerouting to take the trail off roads has been accomplished by Clair Piersol and his cohorts.

KENNETT SQUARE SECTION: C.C.T.C. (Chadds Ford to White Clay Creek at Delaware-Pennsylvania line). Section has received a great deal of attention from Kay Way. Much scouting has been done, a tentative route agreed upon, and many landowners have agreed to enter into agreements with us.

BLUE HEN SECTION: U.D.O.C. (Del.-Pa. line to Iron Hill Park southwest of Newark, Del.). John Wriston, Trails supervisor for U.D.O.C., has recently returned from sabbatical leave and has been doing a great deal of scouting this fall.

ELKTON SECTION: B.H.C. (Iron Hill Park to Elk Neck State Forest). No progress to date.

HEAD OF ELK SECTION: W.T.C. (Elk Neck State Forest to Havre de Grace). Trail through the State Forest has been blazed. Remainder of the trail has been scouted and negotiations with landowners are under way.

CONOWINGO SECTION: W.T.C. (Havre de Grace to Broad Creek). We can do nothing at present on trail from Havre de Grace to Conowingo Dam. Philadelphia Electric has tacit agreement with the State of Maryland to lease or sell ground for hiking trail. P.E. does not want two separate trails, so we must work with Maryland on this item, and their plans are not concrete at this time. The trail from Broad Creek has been scouted and we are presently awaiting P.E.'s approval of our route.

PEACH BOTTOM SECTION: Unassigned. (Broad Creek to Peach Bottom Atomic Power Station). No progress to date.

CASTLE FINN SECTION: Y.H.C. (Peach Bottom to Norman Wood Bridge). Scouting continues.

LAKE ALDRED SECTION: Y.H.C. (Norman Wood Bridge to Otter Creek Rec. Area). Almost ready to break trail. Final negotiations with property owners is the only thing holding us up. Dick Tobias reports that the York club hopes to have this section in by July 1981.

LONG LEVEL SECTION: Y.H.C. (Otter Creek Rec. Area to Wrightsville). Scouting continues.

ACCOMAC SECTION: Unassigned. (Wrightsville to Yorkhaven). Some scouting has been done by some members of Y.H.C.

CONEWAGO SECTION: Unassigned. (Yorkhaven to Governor Pinchot State Park). No progress to date.

. WHISKEY SPRINGS SECTION: Unassigned. (Pinchot Park to Whiskey Springs on A.T.). No progress; however, Earl Shaffer has a route planned.

CLUB OFFICERS

Enclosed with this Newsletter (first page of the Membership List) is a list of club officers. You will note that the office of Second Vice President and Educational Director has not been filled. If you or anyone you know would be able to give a little time to fill this vacancy, please let us know.

MONEY

Our first year's financial report, together with a letter from our Treasurer and Membership Chairman, accompanies this Newsletter. As you will note, our financial condition is not as pleasing as we would like it to be. Some financial help upon which we had counted did not materialize.

In the year to come we shall need money for signs (we are obligated to larger landowners to erect proper signs on the trail), to build foot bridges and stiles, for additional insurance premiums when we sign agreements with large landholders such as P.E., P.P.&L., Gladfelter, etc.

(They have their own agreement documents and will not be using ours); for paint, brushes, tools, etc.; for office and administrative expenses (postage, typing, photocopying, telephone, etc.) which are gradually becoming too extensive to be covered "out of pocket" by the officers as has been done in the past.
