Minutes of the Board of Director's Meeting

March 13, 1905

The Mason-Dixon Trail System Board of Director's met at the home of Dick and Anne Tobias on March 13, 1985. Present were, in addition to the Tobias', Mary Bleecker, Barbara Cantera, Turner Darden, Ron Gray, Clair Piersol, Warren Raab, Carl Reachard, and Kay Way.

JUNE 22, 1985 Work Hike. Meet at 9:00 A.M. at Lock 12, area to be covered is Mill Creek to Holtwood Dam. A Meeting is to be held at noon at the new shelter.

Trail Reports Ron: The trash dumping problem in the Cuff's Run area still exists. The area is heavily used by fishermen, who apparently created the boaters access before MDTS arrived.

The Red Lion water company has permission to draw three million gallons of water daily from the Susquehanna River. Richard Yost: Volunteered to be responsible for six miles of the trail in the Holtwood area.

Kay Way : The treasury contains about \$1,250. Dues renewals total \$412. Sixteen members have contributed money above the \$4 dues for 1985. Bob Yost contributed \$250 for a life membership. The board approved using treasury funds for the constrc-

tion of the April 27 bridge decking if the request for these funds is not approved at the KTA meeting at the end of March.

Turner Darden will complete a letter recognizing the Recognition contributions of Pat Boyle and Bob Yost to the trail's beginning. Mary Bleecker will supply the édeas for this letter from the last meeting. Clair Piersol will investigate an appropriate frame.

> Warren Raab read a letter he sent to Dick Tobias containing execellent suggestions for increasing the active participation of Pennsylvania and Delaware area hikers in MDTS activities. A previously untried approach would be a brochure describing the trail's location and club's activities in campling, hiking, and related activities. The above brochure could be placed in shops, campgrounds supply stores on/and near the trail.

A letter from Pat Boyle reminded the Board that MDTS had agreed to name an early structure on the trail for Mr. Hommer

There was discussion by the Board about naming the new shelter after Mr. Hom.mer This question was not resolved.

There was also discussion about changing the name of the Deer Creek Bridge to "Homemer". It was resolved to leave the Deer Creek Bridge name as it is for clarity of identification by trail users.

### New Bridge

The new bridge is completed and beautiful. A good turnout on April 27 did the job in one session. It crosses the Deer Creek just as it enters the Susqehanna in the Susquehanna State Park, Maryland, a pretty spot with whole hillsides of Trillium and Dutchman's Breeches.
