Adjournment:

Marion Schultz reported that she had obtained a list of Pennsylvania State legislative oills involving the environment. Marion reports two oills that would de. of special interest to us. One involved Landowners ${ }^{\text { }}$ liability to hikers; the other involved Fails -To Trails.

The M.D.T.S. decided that we should concentrate on supporting th first bill which is known as the "Private Lands and Public Recreation Act"; Pennsylvania State House Bill No. 1567 . The main purpose of the bill is to encourage landomers to make their lands available for puolic recreation by limiting a landowner's liability for injuries to. persons on his property for recreational purposes.

This proposed legislation would help us to move some of our Pennsylvania Trail off roads on to private lands. The bill is currently in the House Committee on Agriculture and Rural Affairs. House Bill \# 1567 must be reported out of the Committee before the legislative session ends this year; otherwise it will "die". Kay Way asked Marion Schultz to write to the Chairman of the Committee on behalf of M.D.T.S. in support of the bill.

Letters to legislators are most effective when they come from the legislator's home district. Marion asked that M.D.T.S. members who live in Pennsylvania write to their individual representatives in support


Dick Tobias suggested that ve might spend some of the money in our Treasury on trail signs. We currently have two signs. One is installed at the Western Terminus of the Meson-Dixon Trail; the other is waiting to be installed at the Eastern Terminus. Additional signs might be installed in State and County Parks and at road crossings. This will be discussed at our next meeting. Suggestions for other possible trail sign locations are requested from all M.D.T.S. memoers. Needed: offers to make signs.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:45 P.M. A delightful supper, provided by Chris Piersol, followed the meeting.
